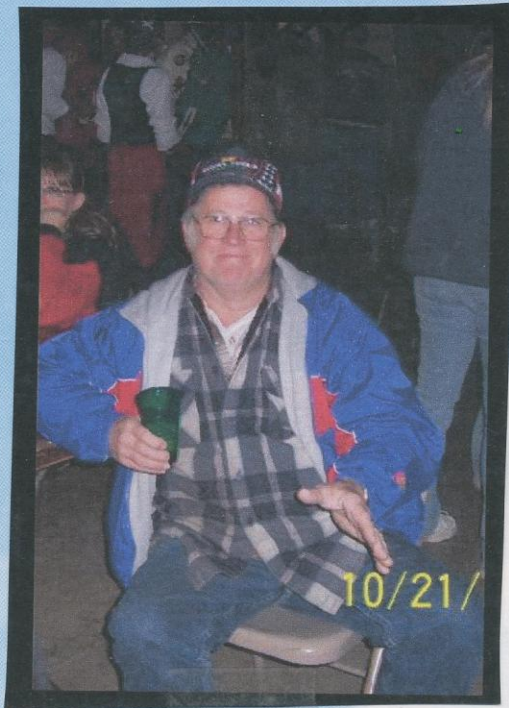


# Vince Eckman

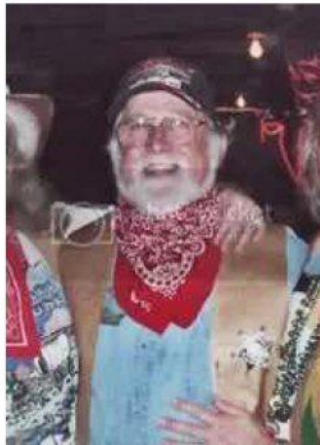
